

We welcome all of you, our Faithful and our Visitors, to St. Mary Antiochian Orthodox Christian Church! It is a pleasure to have you with us as we glorify and praise the Name of our God: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Please sing along with our Choir during the Liturgy.

Please note, as has been the practice of the Church since the Feast of Pentecost, that the Sacrament of Holy Communion can only be given to Orthodox Christians who have prepared themselves by prayer, fasting, regular Confession (at least twice per year ... 7 Yrs. old & up), who attend Liturgy regularly & on time (at least 3 times a month) ... and ... are at peace with all people.

When receiving Holy Communion, please fold your arms over your chest, open your mouth wide, tip your head back slightly, and allow the priest to place the elements in your mouth.

FIRST ANTIPHON: (Refrain - "Through the intercessions of the Theotokos...")

"My heart hath poured forth a good word: I speak of my works to the king. My tongue is the pen of a swiftly writing scribe." / Refrain. / "Grace is poured into thy lips: therefore, God hath blessed thee forever." / Refrain. / "Glory & Now" ... Refrain.

SECOND ANTIPHON: (Refrain – "O Son of God, Who was borne in the arms of righteous Simeon, save us who sing unto Thee. Alleluia.")

"Gird Thy sword upon Thy thigh, O mighty One, in Thy comeliness and Thy beauty. Bend Thy bow, and proceed prosperously, and be king." / Refrain. / "Thine arrows are sharp, O mighty One, in the heart of the king's enemies; whereby the people fall under Thee." / Refrain. / "A scepter of uprightness is the scepter of Thy kingdom." / Refrain. / "Glory & Now" ... and ... "O Only-begotten Son & Word of God ...".

THIRD ANTIPHON: (Sung During The Little Entrance – Tone One)

Verses: Hearken, O daughter, and consider, and incline thine ear; forget also thine own people, and thy father's house. Even the rich among the people shall entreat thy countenance. I shall commemorate thy name in every generation.

AFTER THE LITTLE ENTRANCE:

TROPARION OF THE RESURRECTION: (Tone Two)

When Thou didst submit Thyself unto death, O Thou Deathless and Immortal One, then Thou didst destroy Hell with Thy Godly power; and when Thou didst raise the dead from beneath the earth, all the powers of Heaven did cry aloud unto Thee: O Christ Thou Giver of Life, glory to Thee!

TROPARION OF THE PRESENTATION OF CHRIST: (Tone One)

Rejoice, O Virgin Theotokos, full of grace, for from thee arose the Sun of justice, Christ our God, lighting those who are in darkness. Rejoice and be glad, O righteous elder, carrying in thine arms the Deliverer of our souls, Who granteth us Resurrection.

TROPARION OF THE DORMITION: (Patron Feast Day - Tone One)

In thy birth-giving, O Theotokos, thou didst keep and preserve virginity; and in thy falling-asleep thou hast not forsaken the world for thou wast translated into life,

being the Mother of Life. Wherefore, by thine intercessions, deliver our souls from death.

KONTAKION OF THE PRESENTATION OF CHRIST: (Tone One)Thou, O Christ God, Who by Thy Birth, didst sanctify the Virgin's womb, and, as is meet, didst bless Simeon's arms, and didst also come to save us; preserve Thy fold in wars, and confirm them whom Thou didst love, for Thou alone art the Lover of mankind.

EPISTLE: 1 Timothy 4:9-15 (Thirty-Second Sunday After Pentecost)

HOLY GOSPEL: <u>Luke</u> 19:1-10 (Fifteenth Sunday of Luke – "Zacchaeus")

Concerning the "Kiss of Peace," prior to the Nicene Creed, we encourage you to greet those around you with a handshake, saying: "Christ is in Our Midst!" ... the response being: He is And Always Shall Be!" In this way, we express: (1) our Joy that God has acted to restore our Communion with Him ... and ... Epistle

(For the Thirty-second Sunday after Pentecost)

The Lord is my strength and my song. With chastisement hath the Lord chastened me.

The Reading from the First Epistle of St. Paul to St. Timothy. (4:9-15)

Timothy, my son, the saying is sure and worthy of full acceptance. For to this end, we toil and strive, because we have our hope set on the living God, Who is the Savior of all men, especially of those who believe. Command and teach these things. Let no one despise your youth, but set the believers an example in speech and conduct, in love, in faith, in purity. Until I come, attend to the public reading of scripture, to preaching, to teaching. Gospel

(For the Fifteenth Sunday of Luke—"Zacchaeus")

The reading from the Holy Gospel according to St. Luke. (19:1-10)

At that time, Jesus entered Jericho and was passing through. And there was a man named Zacchaeus; he was a chief tax collector, and rich. And he sought to see Who Jesus was, but could not, on account of the crowd, because he was small of stature. So he ran on ahead and climbed up into a sycamore tree to see Jesus, for He was to pass that way. And when Jesus came to the place, He looked up and said to him, "Zacchaeus, make haste and come down; for I must stay at your house today." So he made haste and came down, and received Him joyfully. And when they saw it they all murmured, "He has gone in to be the guest of a man who is a sinner." And Zacchaeus stood and said to the Lord, "Behold, Lord, the half of my goods I give to the poor; and if I have defrauded anyone of anything, I restore it fourfold." And Jesus said to him, "Today salvation has come to this house, since he also is a son of Abraham; for the Son of man came to seek and to save the lost."

Saint of the Day – February 4, 2024

THE VENERABLE ISIDORE OF PELUSIUM

Isidore was an Egyptian by birth, the son of a prominent family, and the kinsman of the Alexandrian Patriarchs Theophilus and Cyril. Having studied all the secular disciplines, he renounced worldly riches and glory, and for the love of Christ, he devoted himself completely to the spiritual life. He was a great and ardent defender and interpreter of the Orthodox Faith. According to the historian Nicephorus, St. Isidore wrote more than ten thousand letters to various individuals. In these, he reproached some, counseled others, and comforted and instructed still others. In one letter St. Isidore wrote: "It is more important to teach by a life of doing good than to preach in eloquent terms." In another, he said: "If one desires that his virtues appear great, let him consider them small, and they will surely manifest themselves as great." The first and basic rule for St. Isidore was this: "First do and then teach, according to the example of our Lord Jesus." At the time of the persecution of St. John Chrysostom, when the entire population was divided into two camps--one for him and one against him--St. Isidore, this great pillar of Orthodoxy, sided with St. John Chrysostom. He wrote to Patriarch Theophilus that Chrysostom was a great light of the Church, and begged him to avoid rancor toward him. Isidore lived long and accomplished much, glorifying Christ God with his life and his writings. Isidore took up habitation in the Kingdom of Christ in about the year 436 A.D.

REFLECTION

Impose upon yourself some form of penance [Epitimija] for the sins of others. If you have judged or punished someone, impose upon yourself a form of penance. You should also suffer voluntarily for the sins of sinners. This is pleasing to God. This mystery was known by the saints, who condemned themselves for the sins of others. Even non-Christian peoples perceived this mystery. There exists this custom in China: When an executioner beheads a criminal who is sentenced to death, he then approaches the judge and informs him that the verdict was carried out. The judge reimburses him with a silver coin because he has executed a criminal, and then he orders that he be given forty lashes for having killed a man. Christian saints profoundly understood the mystery of sin and human injustice. For the saints, every human sin has a history as long as the distance from Adam to us.

The Priest-Martyr Charalampias

One of the lesser-known saints on our calendar is that of Saint Charalampias, who is commemorated on February 10th.

Saint Charalampias was a priest who lived in a small town in Asia Minor in the second century. He suffered much at the hands of the pagan authorities who tried to make him renounce his Christianity. Despite the many tortures they inflicted upon him, the priest Charlampias refused to renounce Christ. Amazingly, the saintly priest survived the numerous attempts to break his spirit and end his life through torture. This caused many to come to faith in Jesus Christ.

Thousands sought out Saint Charalampias in his prison cell to ask for his blessing. They referred to him as the "man who could not be killed." This further enraged the pagan Emperor, Servius, who ordered Charalampias to be brought to Antioch to be beheaded. Tradition tells us that just before his executioners were about to behead him, a voice was heard from the heavens that said, "Well done my good and faithful servant." With that, Saint Charalampias fell asleep in the Lord just before the executioner's blow was struck. Nonetheless, Saint Charalampias is regarded as a martyr who willingly gave up his life for the sake of his Faith.

Through his prayers, may we walk firmly in the footsteps of Christ and find strength in the face of the struggles that come our way.
